Health Plan Proposed Changes to Reduce Costs

- Continue to offer HRA Plan and Catastrophic Plan
- Eliminate the Enhanced Plan for employees effective October 1, 2008
  - Estimated plan savings is \$505,391 or 15%
  - Should drive utilization to the Clinic
  - Reduces GASB future liability

Employee Clinic Versus System

Benefits of Employee Clinics

- Doctor will have more time to spend with patient on each visit to discuss lifestyle and wellness initiatives
- Improve early detection and intervention
- Improve disease management
- Improve health and wellness of plan members
- Reduce lost work time for doctor's visits
- Happier and Healthier Employees

- ❑ Specifications released November 30, 2007
- ❑ RFP advertised December 5 & 12, 2007
- ❑ Pre Proposal Conference – January 8, 2008
- ❑ Deadlines for Proposals – January 15, 2008
- ❑ April 1, 2008 – Contract with ATC completed
- ❑ 75 days to finish out clinic space
- ❑ 90 days to recruit physicians and staff
- ❑ Expected Date of Clinic Operation – July 1, 2008
  - City of Carrollton
  - City of Lewisville
  - City of Coppell

Recommended Vendor

- ❑ Care ATC
  - Provides employers with on-site physicians, medical staff and clinic in addition to their current medical coverage

Implementation Plan

- ❑ First two weeks in June
  - Hold employee briefings using Care ATC staff to brief employees on clinic and plan changes
- ❑ Last two weeks in June
  - Care ATC staff will be on site at City locations to conduct Personal Health Screenings
- ❑ When employees schedule an appointment, doctor will review personal health data and address any issues
- ❑ Clinic physician will contact all employees who have “urgent” or “emergent” issues based on the results of the Personal Health Screenings and urge employees to schedule an appointment

Discussion was held regarding the cost of clinic operations. Ms. Galler reminded the City Council that these figures do not take into account the real cost savings of early detection that would not have been caught before due to the health assessment.

Mayor Carey questioned if there would be still be a health plan with Cigna that the employees could use for medications. Ms. Galler assured the City Council that any employee that has maintenance medicine would still be able to utilize the insurance company at the negotiated rate through Cigna. She further advised that there would have to be extensive education so employees could understand the changes. Ms. Galler explained that the clinic would also be able to give out test strips for diabetics; although they would not be able to obtain their medication at the clinic. Ms. Galler advised that the clinic would not carry narcotics; however, they would have common medications. She further advised the clinic would be able to address wellness, preventative, and primary care needs.

Discussion was held regarding if a cost savings was not seen could the City opted out, and what would happen if another city did opt out. Ms. Galler advised that the City of Carrollton will be signing the contract with Care ATC and the City of Lewisville would do an Interlocal Agreement with the City of Carrollton. She further advised that should another City opted out then the clinic would mostly likely change the time and days they are opened to compensate.

Mayor Pro Tem Ueckert questioned how the City of Lewisville would pay Care ATC. Ms. Galler advised that the contract is set up based on the number of employees and the City would be billed monthly based on the number of employees on the plan.

City Manager King advised that the City will have to move fairly rapidly if we are going to jump in with Carrollton.

Ms. Galler stated that she felt this continued the City of Lewisville's jump into wellness and consumer driven plans, and that the clinic would be a great recruitment mechanism and enhance morale. She stated that for every \$100 spent on medical costs, at least 75% can be attributed to lifestyle. City Manager King stated that the key was to make sure that the clinic does not add cost structure. Ms. Barron advised that was the reason that City staff recommended dropping the Enhanced Plan which would create a significant cost savings to the City. She further advised that Carrollton is not doing that at this point; however, they are planning on dropping their Enhanced Plan in the future.
