An ex boyfriend had forced himself into the victim's apartment and was fighting with her brother. By the time the police arrived, the suspect had left on foot. An officer pursued the suspect and deployed her taser when the suspect stopped and turned was coming toward the officer. No contact was made and the suspect confirmed that he never felt the tase. When the officer approached the male, he got off his bicycle and threw it at the squad car damaging the vehicle. The male then ran toward the officer aggressively and punched the officer in the right temple. After a scuffle where both the officer and the male were on the ground, the officer struck the male and was able to subdue him enough to handcuff him.
