



Unauthorized Dumping is **Illegal!**

Disposing of debris into the sanitary sewer system is a harmful and potentially dangerous situation that can result in blockages or sanitary sewer overflows, the accumulation of toxic or explosive gases, or environmental damage. Illegal dumping can cause overflows of the sanitary sewer creating public health and environmental concerns.

Materials Not Allowed to be Discharged



Do Not Dump!

- **Any Construction Material**
- **Grass clippings, leaves, rocks**
- **Dredged or fill material**
- **Non-permitted Industrial process and wash water**
- **Process chemicals and materials**
- **Hazardous Materials**
- **Soaps, Solvents, and Degreasers**
- **Painting and paint removal products**
- **Adhesives, Glue, and Epoxies**
- **Non-permitted Commercial vehicle or car wash waste**
- **Saw-cut slurry water**
- **Gasoline and other petroleum products**
- **Antifreeze**
- **Fertilizers, Pesticides and Herbicides**
- **Portable Toilet Waste**
- **Wood, concrete, glass**
- **Trash, Street and Loading Area wash water**



UNAUTHORIZED DUMPING AND DISCHARGES CAN CREATE POTENTIAL HEALTH AND ENVIRONMENTAL CONCERNS

Only City employees may access manholes for maintenance or monitoring activities. An example of illegal dumping is a commercial vacuum truck dumping its contents of grease, oil, or septic tank effluent into a public manhole. Another example is the dumping of construction materials into the sanitary sewer system.



Remember – What belongs in the sanitary sewer – is sewage.
